

### Rich Fruit Cake Ingredients

1/2tsp Lemon Juice	250g Currants	1/2tsp Almond Essence
1/2tsp Ground Cloves	125g Mixed Peel	90g Glace Cherries
1/2 Cup Rum/Brandy or Sherry	90g Blanched Almonds	1/4tsp Nutmeg
60g Self Raising Flour	250g Butter	1/2tsp Ginger
250g Sultanas	250g Brown Sugar	1/2tsp Vanilla Essence
250g Chopped Raisins	4 Eggs	250g Plain Flour

Mix all cut up fruits & nuts together. Sprinkle with spirits and leave overnight. Sift together flours and spices. Cream butter and sugar, add eggs 1 at a time, add essences and then alternately flour and fruit. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place Mixture in prepared cake tin, no larger than 8 Inches squared. Bake in a slow oven for 3 - 4 hours to ensure uniformity and depending upon size it is suggested that the raisens be snipped in 3 or 4 pieces, cherries 4- 5 pieces and almonds cross wise 3-4.

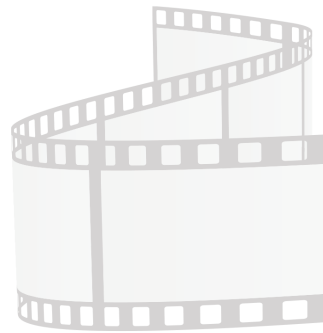

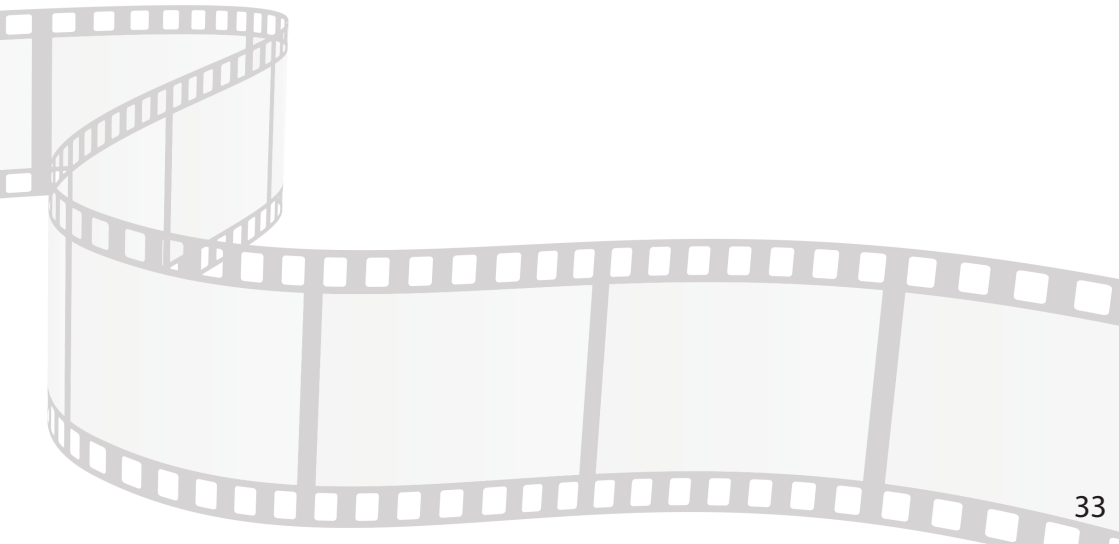
